

Nautical Puzzler

Can anyone explain what a Lugger is? Can a Lugger have more than one mast? What is the similarity between a Chinese Junk and a Lugger?

Answer

A lugger is a vessel with a square sail rigged fore and aft. Here, from the third edition of "Royce's Sailing Illustrated", are drawings of several kinds of luggers.



One can only surmise that the original square sail was simple and obvious. In ancient Egypt the wind was usually upstream over the Nile so a square sail worked well. From time to time, however, the wind must have changed and they tried to point higher and higher into the wind using the square sail. They must have discovered this with great difficulty. Consider that early vessels did not use a keel. They did use oars. Any sail in a cross wind will produce a lot of leeway. To compensate, they must have used their oars. Over time they probably discovered that just holding the oars in place (like a centerboard) would suffice. From this they must have evolved a keel or centerboard.

Not so obvious is the reason for a shorter leading edge. The mast was placed forward of the hull center of resistance so that the boat would point forward. When they rotated the sail to a fore and aft angle this must have caused the boat to turn away from the wind. By making the leading edge shorter they compensated for this effect. It probably led to the development of the lateen sail.

The Academy of Yachting Officers and Professionals was a winner!

The academy was held on February 23, 24 and 25, 2012 at the Wyndham Resort in Orlando, Florida. The curriculum included every important subject that officers and managers of yacht clubs should know. Attendees from the 3 day conference came away with a feeling of profound enlightenment. One of the principle instructors was P/C Joseph Tringalli who holds a JD degree and is an assistant Attorney General for the State of Florida. He is also the protocol officer for the FCA. His lectures focused on law as it affects Yacht Clubs including Law and Liability, the American's With Disabilities Act and Discrimination. One might well guess that a club that might choose to deny membership to someone would be concerned with discrimination law.

One of the attendees, Commodore Wayne Stewart of the Halifax River Yacht Club, said he was very pleased that he attended. He felt that the knowledge gained will be very valuable for managing the club and keeping it out of legal and financial trouble.

Some of the other lectures that he said would help him in his duties covered Robert's Rules of Order. A sound knowledge of these rules is the key to keeping meetings running smoothly but fairly.

Other subjects covered by the academy included flag protocol and uniforms, insurance and hazards, death and taxes and balancing the books. Commodore Stewart recommended the academy to any officer coming up through the chairs

FCA Olympic Report

FCA members and Associates' have had the opportunity to meet Zach Railey and Brad Kendell as program participants at FCA meetings. Paige Railey, sister of Zach is the newest member of FCA's Olympic sailor support team and the US Sailing team alpha graphics.



FCA's Olympic Support Sailors:

Zach Railey, 27, races in the Finn singlehanded men's heavyweight class and won the Silver Medal in the 2008 Olympics held in China. He is a native of St. Petersburg, Fl. and a graduate of the University of Miami (Fl). Currently, he is ranked #1 in the Finn Class by the International Sailing Federation (ISAF), the international governing body for the sport of sailing.

Paige Railey, 23, competes in the Laser Radial class; the singlehanded boat designed by the Olympic Committee for individual women sailors. Paige is a 4-time World Champion in the Laser Radial class, a 2-time Open European Champion and the first U.S. female to win the ISAF Rolex "Sailor of the Year" award. She is a graduate of the University of South Florida.

Brad Kendell, 30, is the mainsail trimmer for Team USA 674, which competes in the Sonar sloop class in the Paralympics. Brad's team was named "Paralympics Team of the year" for 2010 by the US Sailing Association; they are currently (2011) ranked #4 in the world. The Sonar is sailed in the Paralympics with a 3-person crew, two of whom must be disabled sailors. Brad's artificial legs were made by Hanger Orthopedics Group of Tampa, the same company that made the tail for Winter the Dolphin.

Regatta/Olympic update:

Zach finished first in the ISAF sailing world championships in Perth, Australia, December 13-18, 2011. This is the second and final Olympic team event to identify a USA Olympic qualifier.

Zach won the Gold medal in the Finn class in Miami at the US Sailing Rolex Regatta. US Sailings Golden Torch Trophy, awarded to the US sailor with the best overall performance at the US Sailing Rolex Miami OCR, this year went to Finn Class Gold Medalist, Zach Railey (Clearwater, Fl.)

Paige finished in the ISAF World Championships in Perth, Australia, December 13-18, 2011. This is the second and final event identifying Paige as the USA Olympic qualifier.

Paige was the top US sailor in the Laser Radial Class, at US Sailings Rolex Miami. Paige won the Medal race and finished 8th overall, in the Regatta.

On January 16, 2012 Paige presented a check to the Sarcoma Foundation of America. A commitment she had made to donate a portion of her bonus earnings from 2011 racing season, to honor Olivia, a young former teenage friend and competitive sailor from Clearwater, Fl. There is a website www.olivialives.com in her honor. Olivia's true love and passion was sailing and learned to sail at the Clearwater Sailing Center at the age of 8.

The America's Disabled Open Regatta was at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club on December 2-4, 2011. The team of Rick Doerr, Brad Kendell and Hugh Freund, (TeamUSA674), did extremely well, with a fourth place finish among some tough International competition.

The International Association for Disabled Sailing World IFDS Regatta was held in Charlotte Harbor, Fl. January 7-15, 2012. US Team 674 finished 9th overall and second of the USA teams. There were 12 Sonar teams and 4 US boats represented among the International field.

The Miami Rolex OCR was held in Miami, Fl. January 22-28th. Brad's Sonar team finished first for the US in this regatta. This was the final qualifying series for the selection of the US Paralympic team.

It came down to the last race of the day, with the US team of Callahan (Cape Coral, Fl.) having to finish within (2) two boats of the US team 674 (Doerr, Kendell, Freund), posting a (7th) to our 8th. It was that close in determining the Sonar US team Olympic representative! FCA is proud to have supported and sponsored these Paralympians. Our congratulations to US Team 674 for a great competitive run as the Olympic qualifier. It was a tough and heartbreaking loss.

Share Zach and Paige's Olympic Dream event:

The Clearwater Olympic Sailing Committee has set Friday, April 20, 2012 at the Clearwater Marine Aquarium, home of Winter the Dolphin, as the date and site for the fund raiser for Olympians Zach and Paige Railey. Zach and Paige along with Brad Kendell will be in attendance for this event. We are in the process of researching banners etc. as options for FCA exposure. Additional event information will be provided as it becomes available. If you have a desire to attend this event we have asked the Chart House, Clearwater, Fl. to give a special rate to FCA members. This would be on a first come first serve basis and reservations should be made soon. Call 727-449-8007 and mention FCA for the room rate.

At the Palm Coast Yacht Club membership meeting, FCA Members and Associates openly and enthusiastically endorsed Zach and Paige, with a \$1200 donation toward their bid for Olympic Gold and FCA became a Gold sponsor for this high profile event.

FCA Members and Associates have raised the bar for enthusiasm, energy and commitment to the mission of support for competitive youth sailing in Florida! Olympians Zach and Paige Railey will make a definite statement for US sailing in Weymouth, England, and FCA will be onboard!!!!

Guided your Club through a major financial disaster.

Been responsible for significant growth in your Clubs membership.

Performed community service which brought distinction to your Club or any similar accomplishment.


