





Marking the Milestone of Five Years

Halifax River Yacht Club, Daytona Beach - October 25 and 26, 2013

Although a few weeks prematurely, we closed out our fifth year at this annual meeting. Halifax River Yacht Club was a perfect setting to hold this meeting. The members and staff were most gracious hosts for FCA. In view of this also being the 500th anniversary of Florida, history was very much the theme of the meeting.

Friday started with a tour of *The Casements* - the winter home of John D. Rockefeller until his death. The tour was followed by a lunch at Las Bistro an original Sears & Roebuck catalog home built in 1924.

In the afternoon, a cocktail cruise on the Halifax River was enjoyed on two yachts. P/C Wayne Stewart and his wife Eloise hosted one group on *Megalove*. Mary and I hosted another group on the *Irish Rover*. The weather was perfect and I got to relax when I turned over the helm to co-pilots P/C Phyllis Seaton and P/C Larry Kimmerling. I have to admit I felt a lot more comfortable in that P/C Pete Tyson was standing watch to insure no one strayed out of the narrow channel.

After the cruise everyone repaired to one of the two bars at HRYC prior to enjoying the fantastic Seafood Buffet which is always a hit at this great club.

Saturday morning the General Membership meeting commenced at 9:00 a.m. with all officers and committee chairs making their reports. Several major items were announced following the meeting of the Executive Committee on Friday afternoon:

- A committee was established, chaired by P/C Tom Reynolds, to investigate the establishment of an FCA Foundation. Such a Foundation would provide a much greater vehicle for raising funds to support the myriad of yachting related activities that FCA has supported in the past five years - such as our Olympic sailing teams. The Foundation would also serve as the "clearing house" for selecting programs worthy of our support.
- Renewed emphasis will be placed on the Ambassador Program. Our Ambassadors not only serve in delivering the FCA message to clubs that are not yet Chapters but also act as liaisons between our current Chapters and the Executive Committee. This year we will be making a new effort to have members of the Executive Committee visit current Chapters with their Ambassador. There is probably no greater need in this organization than to hear from each of our members what they are getting from FCA membership and what we can do to improve the value of your membership!
- Continuing with the concept of better connecting with our members, we will be returning to printing at least two issues of the Commodores Journal this year. In tracking our readership of the e-journal (don't worry this isn't like NSA tracking,) we find a disappointing number of our members are reading this and other digital communication.
- We will also be looking at some other items regarding the Four Star Commodore Program and the nominating procedures in our bylaws.

Also announced at the meeting were the recipients of the 2013 Four Star Commodore Award. They are P/C Wayne Stewart, Halifax River Yacht Club; P/C Phyllis Seaton, Fort Walton Yacht Club and P/C Charles Smith, Pensacola Yacht Club. These Commodores will be receiving their awards in January and the next issue of the Commodores Journal will have a complete story of each recipient.

Also recognized at the meeting were three Commodores also nominated for the Four Star Award. They were P/C Jeffrey Brooks, Bay Point Yacht Club; P/C Peter Tyson, Pelican Yacht Club and P/C Robert Schwalm, Platinum Point Yacht Club.

It was great that we received six nominations this year and everyone should remember that just to be nominated is a very distinctive honor, as the nominations must be endorsed by at least three of the club's Past Commodores. It is highly laudable to be selected by your peers for this honor.

The International Commodores Association also made a major announcement at this meeting, the details of which are outlined in a separate article in this publication.

P/C Kathy Champagne, Navy Yacht Club, Pensacola, made a presentation about their latest WAVE event and the program in general. This program was highlighted in a previous Journal and is something that every yacht club - not just FCA chapter clubs - should consider!

The meeting was recessed for all to enjoy a great lunch buffet in the main dining room overlooking the HRYC docks and the Halifax River beyond. After lunch a presentation was made by Professor Joe Vetter, a local historian, who talked about the history of Florida with some focus on local history. After his talk, he held a mini-quiz and it was great to see how many of our members were paying attention during his presentation.

Our next speaker was Dan Friend, also a local professor of history, but he concentrated on a project he is involved with to return to Florida one of the WWII tugboats built locally for the war for the Army (yes, the Army) and saw action as part of the D-Day invasion. His presentation was fascinating and after we passed the hat (literally, we used P/C Alan Adams's uniform cover) and raised almost \$400 for this project.

The formal meeting was concluded and everyone had a chance to get a nap or quench their thirst. For those who took a nap, cocktails started at 5:30 p.m. and we all assembled an hour later for what has to have been the largest Sundown Ceremony ever held at an FCA meeting. Someone who was counting, relayed to me that they counted a total of 96 either in formation or watching.

Dinner commenced at 7:30 p.m. followed by the Change of Watch.

We all owe a great deal to the officers, Executive Committee members, committee chairs and members that have done so much for FCA since our beginning. I feel very honored to be able to follow in their footsteps.

We have certainly come a long way in the past five years. The proof of our worth, however, will be in our ability to sustain going forward. To succeed in our mission we must provide value to our members and be a resource to support the yacht club community in Florida. To accomplish that objective, support in many areas is needed from our membership.

We all know that the more you put into an organization - the more you get back. Therefore, I strongly encourage you to join us at one of our meetings this year and get involved!



ICA To Concentrate on Education!

"When you come to a fork in the road, take it!" Yogi Berra

When the International Commodores Association (ICA) was conceived, it undertook a split mission - provide an educational resource to the yacht club community and to aid in the establishment of state, regional or national Commodore organizations.

Over the past three years, we have learned that many Commodores, not already organized, have little to no interest, or perceive no value in becoming part of a formal group. In addition, those Commodores already part of a regional, national or international Commodores are satisfied with the status quo.

Also, for the sake of candor, ICA may have failed in its marketing approach and was unable to differentiate itself from existing Commodore organizations.

That being said, over that same three year period, ICA developed new educational programs and established the Academy of Yachting Officers and Professionals. This past November, we held our third annual session. Our second session had twice the attendance of our first and our third session had three times the attendance of our first.

Based on these results we are certain there is a real need for education in the yachting community and not only for yacht club officers, directors and managers. Therefore, with the realization that our true core competency is education we have undertaken a complete reorganization.

As of December 31, 2013, the International Commodores Association will no longer exist. We will be reincorporating as a 501(c)3 educational organization known as the **International Yachting Institute**. In addition, we will be changing our branding to show that we are concentrating strictly on education and are no longer involved in the organization of any groups.

We envision providing all of the yachting community - yacht clubs, all Commodore organizations, sailing and other maritime groups - with our educational and related services.

Primarily, we will be expanding our educational programs and modules to provide educational support where it is needed in the yachting community. In addition, we will be exploring our role in providing publications needed in the yachting community. Finally, we intend to provide a website that will serve as an internet "directory" of all things yachting.

It would be impossible for us to close one door and open the next without recognizing the support, both financial and spiritual, that we have received over the past several years from the Florida Commodores Association. We are grateful and look forward to continuing to support all of the yacht club community and Commodore associations.


Immediate Past Commodore Larry Kimmerling

The most significant sailing performances of the year are being celebrated by US Sailing with the announcement of its short list of nominees for the 2013 Rolex Yachtsman and Yachtswoman of the year awards. The nominees will be reviewed by a panel of noted sailing journalist who discuss the merits of each nominee and will vote to determine US Sailing's 2013 Rolex Yachtsman and Yachtswoman of the year. The winners will be announced in mid January and honored on Tuesday, February

25th, 2014 during a ceremony at the St. Francis Yacht Club in San Francisco, Ca. The six women nominees short listed for US Sailing 2013 Rolex Yachtswoman of the year includes

our very own Laser Radial World Bronze medalist **Paige Railey** from Clearwater, Florida.
